• Jesus Answered with teaching and exhortations

- 8 "But Rabbi," they said, "a short while ago the Jews tried to stone you, and yet you are going back there?"
 9 Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours of daylight? A man who walks by day will not stumble, for he sees
 by this world's light.
 10 It is when he walks by night that he stumbles, for he has no light."
 11 After he had said this, he went on to tell them, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep: but I am going there to wake him up."
 12 H is disciples replied, "Lard, if he sleeps, he will get better."
 13 Jesus had been speaking of his death, but his disciples thought he meant natural sleep.
 14 So then he told them plainly. "Lazarus is dead, "I so that," so that you may believe. But I su go to him."

- 20 When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went out to meet him, but Mary stayed at home.
- 21 "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died.
- 22 But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask.'
- 23 Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."



- Jesus Called to belief
- 24 Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day."
- 25 Jesus said to her, "I AM the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies;
- 26 and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?"
- . 27 "Yes, Lord," she told him, "I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who was to come into the world."
