



Early Deacons chosen- Acts 6:² Then the twelve summoned the multitude of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God and serve tables. ³Therefore, brethren, seek out from among you seven men of *good* reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business; 4 but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word." ⁵And the saying pleased the whole multitude. And they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch, ⁶ whom they set before the apostles; and when they had prayed, they laid hands on them.

8 Likewise deacons must be reverent, not double-tongued, not paying attention much to wine, not living from the profits of sinful activity, 9 holding the mystery of the what it means to believe, with a conscience that is pure and clean. 10 But let these also firstly be tested; then in time let them serve as deacons, if being found unaccused of impropriety. 11 In the same manner, their wives must be reverent, not gossips, abstainers of wine, believers in the whole faith. 12 Let deacons be the males of one wife, presiding honestly over their children and their own houses. 13 For those who have served in a good way as deacons purchase for themselves a good standing and great confidence in the faithfulness found in Christ Jesus.

14 These things I write to you, expecting to come to you shortly; 15 but if I am delayed, I write so that you may understand in what way you ought to conduct yourself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and support of the truth.

16 And without controversy great is the mystery of holiness: God appeared in the flesh, rendered righteous by the Spirit, gazed upon by angels, heralded among the Gentiles, believed on in the world, and received up into glory.

- ²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her,
 ²⁶ that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word,
 ²⁷ that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish.
- ²⁸ So husbands ought to love their own wives as their own bodies; he who loves his wife loves himself.
- ²⁹ For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as the Lord does the church.
- ³⁰ For we are members of His body, of His flesh and of His bones.
- ³¹ "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh."
- ³² This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church.

Isaiah's Description of Righteousness-

Isa 45:22-24 "Look to Me, and be saved, All you ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other. I have sworn by Myself. The word has gone out of My mouth in righteousness, and shall not return, that to Me every knee shall bow; every tongue shall take an oath. He shall say, 'Surely in the LORD I have righteousness and strength.

<u>2Co 5:21</u> For he hath made him to be sin for us who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.
